This following is just a short list of the numerous responsibilities, jobs and tasks that they took head-on and accomplished this summer. The short list includes:

- Annual cleaning of all classrooms and hallways
- Striping and Waxing of all floors & hallways
- HVAC filter replacement
- Plumbing repairs
- Water fountain repairs
- Roofing repairs
- Electrical repairs
- Generator maintenance
- Ceiling tile replacements
- Airedale cleaning and servicing
- Cleaning of HVAC coils
- Boilers - cleaning and inspection
- Removal and installation of smartboards
- Installation of AC units at both PMG and RVS including metal fabrication to create space for the units & electrical wiring and upgrades for each unit (12 units)
- Internal classroom moves within each building (32)
- Lowering of white boards
- Lowering of soap dispensers
- Removal of coat racks
- Relocation of electrical outlets (higher locations)
- Removal of power poles in classrooms
