Overview

The Student Safety Data System (SSDS) collects two types of information from schools through districts:

- Incidents of violence; vandalism; harassment, intimidation, or bullying (HIB); weapons offenses; substance offenses; restraint; seclusion and any other incident leading to student removal from school; and
- HIB trainings and programs.

This information is collected to fulfill state and federal reporting requirements.

Incidents: What to Report

Any incident that meets Incident Type Definitions for one of the SSDS incident types must be reported through the SSDS system, regardless of whether any disciplinary action was taken. The incident types are as follows:

- Damage to Property
- False Public Alarm
- Fight
- HIB Alleged

- HIB Confirmed
- Kidnapping
- Restraint
- Robbery/Extortion
- Seclusion
- Sexual Assault

- Threat Simple
- Trespass
- Weapon Offense

Incident Categories

Incidents will be reported publicly by the NJDOE in the following five categories:

- -Violence (Assault, Fight, Kidnapping, Robbery/Extortion, Sexual Assault, Sexual Contact, Threat-Criminal, Threat-Simple)
- -Vandalism (Arson, Computer Trespass, Damage to Property, False Public Alarm, Theft, Trespass)
- -Substance Offense
- -Weapon Offense
- -HIB (Confirmed)

School Self-Assessment Program to Determine Grades under the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act

What is the HIB Self-Assessment?

- 1. The Commissioner of Education is required to grade each public school and school district's efforts to implement the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act.
- 2. Each school, through its School Safety/Climate Team (SS/SCT) evaluated the implementation of the ABBR from July 1, 2022 through June 30, 2023 using the Self-Assessment.
- 3. The Self-Assessment tool includes eight core elements that address all of the ABR requirements for schools.
- 4. SS/SCTs assigned a rating for each indicator based on criteria and available documentation.

Overview of Activities to Fulfill Requirements of the School Self-Assessment Program to Determine Grades under ABBR

- -SS/SCT completed the Self-Assessment assigning a rating for each indicator based on criteria and documentation. The maximum grade a school may receive is 78.
- -BOE presentation & submission to NJDOE prior to 10/30/23
- -NJDOE will review data, create and issue school and district grade reports
- -Upon receipt of Official Grade Reports will be reviewed and posted on website within 10 days of receiving official Grade Report from NJDOE

- 8. HIB Reporting

Using the Self-Assessment

Rating scale with 4 categories

- **0** Does Not Meet the Requirements
- 1 Partially Meets the Requirements
- 2 Meets All Requirements
- 3 Exceeds the Requirements
